This sheet is for you to keep- Here is the information you will need for the day of the clinic

The Northern Illinois Outlaws will have leather holsters, guns and ammo at the clinic as part of the clinic, as a way to help you get into the sport we offer a few different style of these things to help you decide what works best for you.

You will need the following:

- Leather Western Saddle is a requirement, bridles do not have this requirement
- A long sleeve shirt is a dress requirement
- A copy of your coggins and health certificate (Out of state only)
- An F.O.I.D card if you are an Illinois resident

Arrival is at 9am, sign in will be open. The clinic will start at 9:30am

- We will be tying horses to the arena wall with their lead and a piece of twine, so please bring your horse into the indoor arena upon arrival to get your assigned spot.
- The seated classroom portion usually runs about an hour where you will learn all the rules and requirements of the sport.
- Following the seated classroom portion you will then be led through the hands on classroom ground work with you and the guns. During this you will learn how to properly load and unload, as well as how to safely fire the guns while in motion by walking through courses.
- After this mornings classroom portions we will break for lunch, the NIO provides a lunch (if you have any dietary restrictions please let us know when you register)
- After eating there will be time to get your horse tacked and warmed up.
- The under saddle portion usually runs about 4 hours and will go through the horses hearing the gun fire all around them to you actually shooting off of their backs.
